FORM: The Overview

FORM is an international alliance of higher education institutions, research libraries, and other research communities based within the Arab region. We are comprised of a diverse array of stakeholder groups involved in the academic research and scholarly communications ecosystems, including local research institutions based in the Arab States and global non-profit organisations working to support Open Science.

FORM is an independent project of the <u>Knowledge E Foundation</u>, (a philanthropic entity established to promote education and work towards a more knowledgable world).

The Arab states have the resources and capability to play a pivotal role in the global transition towards more accessible, sustainable and inclusive research and education models. However, while many institutions and organisations are at the forefront of this change, there is a clear need for something more focused on the specific needs of research communities and research institutions just starting out on their journey towards openness.

Our mission is to support the advancement of Open Science practices in research libraries and universities across the Arab world, by facilitating the exchange of actionable insights and the development of practical policies, and by encouraging the evolution of a strong cross-regional collaborative community.









Our focus is on empowering libraries, higher education institutions, research councils and policy makers to collaborate on activities, projects and resources that promote engagement with, and the generation of, open research – enabling them to better serve the needs of local research communities.

Any research institution or research community based within the Arab region that wishes to support our mission and become a signatory of our principles can become a member.

Becoming a member of FORM means becoming part of an international community of Arab researchers and research institutions, championing the advancement of Open Science policies and practices in your institution, and working in a shared direction for positive change and more sustainable and inclusive educational models.



What We Do

FORM hosts an array of activities throughout the year that aim to meet our overarching goals of encouraging community collaboration, supporting higher education institutions, and developing valuable resources that will help further the Open Science strategies of the region. These activities include working groups, monthly community development activities, and our Annual Forum, hosted every October.

Community Development Activities

Our <u>Community Development Series</u> is a key part of our strategy, designed to provide insights and learning opportunities for all stakeholders looking to engage with Open Science at an institutional level, including funding groups and government ministries, libraries and universities, non-profit solutions providers, and all members of the region's wider research communities.

These free events are held on a monthly basis, online, in collaboration with non-profit organisations and open source solutions providers. The goal is to offer practical guidance on a broad array of issues relating to the implementation of Open Science policies and practices in scholarly ecosystems, from leading global experts.

Our community development activities take place on a monthly basis, and we've already had a year of successful workshops that are freely available to watch on our <u>website</u>.









Member Benefits & Responsibilities

Any research institution or research community based within the Arab region that wishes to support our mission and become a signatory of our principles can become a member. Non-profit organisations and non-profit solutions-providers working to support Open Science policies and practices can also become members or strategic partners.

Our membership is institutional, and it is also free.

Becoming a member of FORM signals your public commitment to contribute actively and constructively to the advancement of Open Science in the tertiary education sector and research communities of the Arab world.

- Recognise the diverse outputs, practices and activities that maximise the quality and impact of research, and where appropriate incorporate these diverse outputs into your assessment criteria.
- Support the development and implementation of Open Science policies and practices at your institution/organisation.
- Gain global and regional visibility for your institution through FORM promotion and support.
- Take advantage of a potential speaking spot to display your institution's latest research at our Annual Forums (subject to availability & quality of proposal).
- Work to enhance the discoverability and visibility of Arab language research.
- Participate in collaborative community development activities and contribute to the growth of an Arab community of best practice in Open Science.

Member organisations have the right to nominate a representative to join and vote at the Members Council, and this representative can also stand for election to the Executive Committee and the FORM Board, and participate in the various working groups and other groundbreaking new initiatives. Member organisations can also attend and present at the Annual Forum, and will receive a discount on the conference fees for their official representative. MEMBERSHIP TYPES

STANDARD MEMBERSHIP

Standard Membership is for Research Institutions and Research Communities within the Arab States. Membership is institutional, with a designated senior staff member acting as the institution's representative and contact, or in their absence, their designated nominee.

STRATEGIC PARTNER MEMBERSHIP

Strategic Partner Membership is for not-for-profit organisations working to advance Open Science in its various forms. Strategic Partner members can be based within the Arab States or elsewhere. Membership is at the organisation-level, with a designated senior staff member acting as the organisation's representative and contact, or in their absence, their designated nominee.

Becoming a Member: Next Steps

Once you're ready to formalise your position as a member of FORM, we will begin the process of onboarding your organisation:

- We will require the name and contact details for your designated representative (the representative can be changed, when required). They will receive regular updates about our activities, and have the option to participate in working groups, stand for election to the Executive Committee, and become involved in other collaborative activities.
- We will add your organisation to our Members' List on our website, and request that provide a high resolution copy of your logo (colour, black and white, and without a background)
- We will issue a short press release, and include a news announcement on our website. Where
 possible we would prefer to include a quotation from you about your interest in Open Science
 and why you are joining FORM, together with some information about your organisation, to
 include in these announcements.
- We will also provide a high resolution copy of our logo together with a brief description of our
 organisation for inclusion on your website. (We can also provide a short quotation if your
 organisation also wishes to publish a news announcement or issue a press release).
- Your representative will also be invited to join our FORM Slack Channel via email. This is an
 online community which serves as a bilingual hub for all Open Science activities across the
 Arab region, allowing our network of Open Science advocates to share ideas, develop
 partnerships, and participate in groundbreaking new projects. Here you are welcome to share
 information about your own organisations activities and updates relating to Open Science,
 develop future partnerships, share ideas, and more!
- If other members of your organisation are interested in our activities, please do send their contact details and we will add them to our mailing list and invite them to join our FORM Slack Community.

Once your onboarding is complete, your staff and faculty will be able to attend, facilitate, and pitch ideas for future community development activities, workshops and working groups.

We would like to encourage you to take full advantage of our shared community spaces to boost your organisations presence in Open Science, as well as help notify your wider network about FORM activities.
